Specific Skating Instructor Responsibilities:

- Instruct ice skating lessons and activities for the age and skating ability of the participants.
- Create your own lesson plans and activities for Tots Skate, Kids Skate and levels
- Assess, and evaluate skating skills of participants.
- Complete end of session report cards for each participant (youth only).

Recommended Qualifications:

- Available to work September to December, and January to March. Thursdays 4:30-7:30pm, Saturdays 8:30-4:30, Sundays 9:00-12:00.
- Experience and/or educational training working with youth and/or adults in an educational, summer camps, or instructional/coaching capacity.
- Experience in figure skating or hockey environments. Experience and/or certification as a skating instructor (leader or instructor)
- Strong interpersonal communication and teamwork skills
- Strong organizational skills, with the ability to be flexible, resilient and prioritize tasks
- Standard First Aid & CPR Level C
- A clear Police Information Check with Vulnerable Sector Search (cost is compensated for successful candidates)

• NCCP and Skate Canada training and certification is a valuable asset.
