[Mini University Summer Camp](#) Instructors and Leaders play a key role in delivering fun, safe, and engaging experiences for children and youth participating in Mini U's on-campus day camps. Staff work with campers from Kindergarten to Grade 8 (and some teen programs), guiding them through a variety of themed activities including sports, arts, science, recreation, and skill-building. This position is ideal for energetic, positive, and responsible individuals who enjoy working with children, value collaboration, and want meaningful summer employment that builds leadership, communication, programming, and group-management skills. We hope that you can join our amazing team and enjoy an unforgettable summer with us!

Role Structure: Instructors vs. Leaders

Camp Instructors

Camp Instructors are **assigned to one specific camp theme for the entire summer**. This means they:

- Stay with the same program each week
- Become specialists in their camp's specific theme
- Refine and improve their activities and lesson plans throughout the summer
- Create a comprehensive supply order form and set up your camp space

Camp Leaders

Camp Leaders **rotate to a different camp each week**, gaining experience with a variety of themes, age groups, and program styles. This means they:

- Are prepared to lead a variety of games and icebreakers with a variety of age groups (K-8)
- Are open-minded and willing to try a wide variety of camps every week
- Support campers and the instructor during instructional blocks
- Bring energy and flexibility to diverse camps across the summer

Supervision & Safety

Both Instructors and Leaders work together in **teams of at least two adults**. Staff members are **never placed alone with a group of campers (10-16 max)**. This ensures shared supervision responsibilities, safe ratios to support camper needs and behavior as well as a collaborative work environment.

Key Responsibilities / Duties

General Responsibilities (All Staff)

- Supervise and lead daily camp activities both indoors and outdoors.
- Create and maintain a safe, positive, inclusive, and engaging environment.
- Support the physical, emotional, and social needs of campers.
- Build relationships with campers, parents/guardians, and co-workers through clear, friendly communication.

- Assist with daily sign-in and sign-out.
- Use positive, effective group-management strategies.
- Complete daily logistics including attendance, hazard assessments, incident reports, set-up, and clean-up.
- Work collaboratively with supervisors and staff to deliver high-quality programming.
- Participate in lifeguard led games and activities in the pool and gymnastics sessions.
- Follow all Mini U and University of Calgary camp policies and emergency procedures.

Instructor-Specific Duties

- Lead 10, 75-minute themed instructional activity blocks each week.
- Create engaging lesson plans aligned with the camp's theme in the spring (remotely).
- Prepare weekly supply lists and manage materials.
- Adjust activities to support campers' varying abilities, interests, and needs.

Leader-Specific Duties

- Lead 10, 75-minute activity/game sessions daily with creativity and energy.
- Facilitate daily "Body Breaks" (washrooms, snacks, water, short games).
- Support Instructors during instructional blocks and group movement across campus.
- Assist with Camp Support Duties like Before & After Care, delivering supplies and dry deck.

Required Qualifications

- Availability Monday–Friday during late June and mid-August (8 hours within 7:45 am-4:45 pm).
- Experience working with children or youth (formal or informal).
- Strong communication, teamwork, and interpersonal skills.
- Ability to stay organized, adapt to change, and multitask effectively.
- Standard First Aid & CPR Level C certification (provided at no cost if hired).
- Clear Police Information Check with Vulnerable Sector Search (provided at no cost if hired).
- Required attendance at staff training in late-June.

Preferred Qualifications

- Previous experience in camps, coaching, teaching, tutoring, recreation, or mentorship.
- Experience leading group games or structured activities.
- Understanding of youth development and inclusive program delivery.
- Interest or background in sports, arts, science, recreation, education, or related areas.
- Confidence and experience with managing challenging behaviours.

Skills & Competencies

- **Leadership:** Confidently guides groups and maintains safe supervision.
- **Communication:** Clear, friendly communication with children, families, and colleagues.
- **Creativity:** Ability to develop fun, engaging, age-appropriate programming.
- **Problem-Solving:** Quick thinking, adaptability, and calm under pressure.
- **Teamwork:** Cooperative, supportive, and positive in team environments.
- **Responsibility & Reliability:** Consistent professionalism, punctuality, and follow-through.
- **Behavior Guidance:** Uses positive and supportive approaches to manage group behaviour.
- **Openness:** Excited to try new activities, lead by example, have fun and be a good role model.
